

The Most Holy Trinity

Faith is a mysterious phenomenon. We are probably stating the obvious since, after all, we are placing our faith in a mystery. Nonsense to many contemporary ears, the idea of placing the service of our whole being in the cause of a mystery would seem irrational. Yet that is what we are involved in when we follow Christ. We are 'in deep' and we recognise mystery as more real to us than the clinically logical. How can this be? Perhaps it could be suggested that, being human, we live our lives on and within different levels. There are times when all of us need to apply our logical, problem-solving intellect to situations for earthly progress or survival, but in many other circumstances we have to understand, relate and connect with others, using sensitivity and emotional intelligence. And thank goodness, because this emphasises and reinforces our freedom to immerse ourselves into the existential, the experiential and the innately spiritual, where the reality of the Holy Trinity can make itself present to us within our personal lives; where we are
